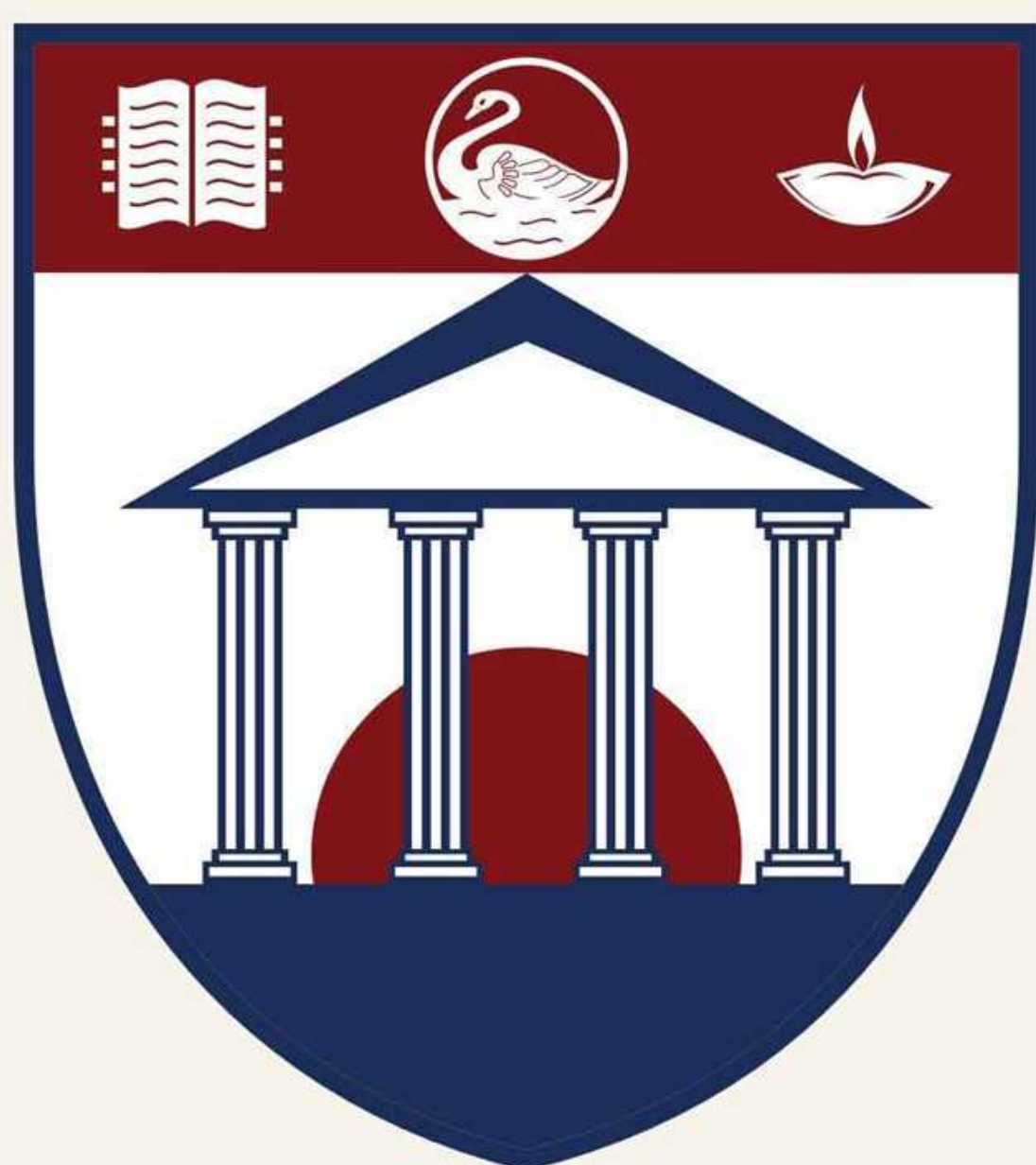

2.2 ACADEMIC STRUCTURE & FRAMEWORK

The University follows a continuous and outcome-based assessment framework. Student performance is evaluated through a combination of internal assessments and end-term examinations to promote consistent academic engagement. Examinations form part of IILM's Outcome-Based Education (OBE) system, assessing your learning and skills in each course.

SGPA & CGPA

Semester and cumulative performance are expressed as SGPA (Semester Grade Point Average) and CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average), calculated from the credits and grade points earned in each course.

WORKED EXAMPLE — HOW SGPA IS COMPUTED

$\text{SGPA} = \text{Sum (Credit} \times \text{Grade Point)} \div \text{Sum Credits.}$

E.g. 4 courses of 4 credits at grade points 9, 8, 8, 7 $\rightarrow (36+32+32+28) \div 16 = 8.0$ SGPA.

PROGRESSION & PROGRAMME COMPLETION

- Students must earn a minimum of 50% of the prescribed credits (MBA) and 40% (all other programmes) to progress to the next academic year.
- A student who fails a subject may take a re-examination; the maximum grade awardable in a re-examination is B+.
- To complete the programme, a student must clear all courses and attain a minimum CGPA of 4.5 at UG level and 5.0 at PG level.
- The degree must be completed within ($\mathbf{n} + 2$) years, where $\mathbf{n}$ is the normal duration of the programme.

2.3 ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

Honesty is *non-negotiable*.

Students are expected to uphold the highest standards of academic honesty. Plagiarism, cheating, impersonation or any unfair academic practice is strictly prohibited and shall attract disciplinary action.

 UNFAIR MEANS (UFM) IN EXAMINATIONS

Mobile phones, smart watches, notes and any other unauthorised material are prohibited in the examination hall. Mere possession of such items constitutes Unfair Means and results in zero marks together with disciplinary action. Students must follow invigilators’ instructions strictly.

2.4 ATTENDANCE POLICY



Students are required to maintain a minimum of **75% attendance in each course** to be eligible to appear in examinations. Attendance is monitored by the University, and it is the responsibility of the student to ensure compliance. **Shortage of attendance may result in debarment from examinations** as per University rules.

2.5 ACADEMIC & CO-CURRICULAR OPPORTUNITIES

Your degree, *your design*.

Under the University’s NEP 2020-aligned four-year undergraduate structure, students complete a foundational stage and then deepen their focus by selecting a major in their discipline, pairing it with a minor from another. Minor options across the University include Design, Psychology, Media & Journalism, Management, Business Analytics and Law. This structure connects each student’s core discipline with interdisciplinary thinking – combining, for example, liberal arts with design for visual and cultural understanding, or communication with psychology for deeper insight into human behaviour.

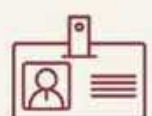

Your rights, your responsibilities, your safeguards.

5.1 CODE OF CONDUCT

Every IILM student is expected to uphold these standards, on and off campus.

Dos

- ✓ Attend all classes, labs, tutorials and academic activities regularly.
- ✓ Carry your University ID card at all times on campus.
- ✓ Follow the academic calendar, examination rules and University regulations.
- ✓ Maintain discipline, decorum and respectful behaviour with faculty, staff and fellow students.
- ✓ Submit assignments, projects, fees and documents within prescribed deadlines.
- ✓ Use University facilities (library, labs, hostels, transport, IT) responsibly.
- ✓ Keep yourself updated through official University communications.
- ✓ Follow safety guidelines, emergency procedures and campus security instructions.
- ✓ Maintain cleanliness and protect University property.
- ✓ Report grievances, concerns or misconduct through proper University channels.

Don'ts

- ✗ Don't engage in any form of ragging, bullying, harassment or discrimination.
- ✗ Don't indulge in cheating, plagiarism, impersonation or any academic misconduct.
- ✗ Don't carry or consume alcohol, tobacco, narcotics or any prohibited substances.
- ✗ Don't damage, misuse or steal University property.
- ✗ Don't disturb classes, examinations or academic activities.
- ✗ Don't use abusive language or indulge in physical or verbal violence.
- ✗ Don't circulate false information or misuse social media to harm the University.
- ✗ Don't enter restricted areas without authorisation.
- ✗ Don't violate hostel rules, library rules or laboratory safety norms.
- ✗ Don't ignore official notices, deadlines or instructions issued by University authorities.

Note: Violation of University rules may result in disciplinary action, including fines, suspension or expulsion, as per University regulations.



5.2 VIOLATION OF DISCIPLINE

Any act of misconduct committed by a student inside or outside the campus shall be an act of violation of discipline. Violations include, among others:

1. Disruption of teaching, examinations, research or administrative work.
2. Damaging or defacing University or personal property inside or outside campus.
3. Wrongful confinement of teachers, officers, employees or students; creating nuisance at their residences.
4. Use of abusive/derogatory slogans; incitement of hatred and violence.
5. Ragging in any form.
6. Eve-teasing or disrespectful behaviour towards women or girl students.
7. Assault upon, intimidation of, or insulting behaviour towards any teacher, officer, employee or student.
8. Causing or colluding in unauthorised entry into the campus or occupation of University premises.
9. Getting enrolled in more than one course simultaneously in violation of University rules.
10. Committing forgery; tampering with or misuse of University documents, records or ID cards.
11. Furnishing false certificates or false information to any University office.
12. Consuming or possessing alcohol, dangerous drugs, tobacco or other intoxicants on campus.
13. Gambling or loitering in University premises.
14. Possessing or using weapons (knives, lathis, iron chains, explosives, firearms) on campus.
15. Arousing communal, caste or regional feelings; creating disharmony among students.
16. Not disclosing identity or not showing University ID card when required.
17. Tearing, defacing, burning or destroying library books or seminar materials.
18. Unauthorised occupation of hostel rooms or acquisition of University furniture.
19. Accommodating guests in hostels without permission of the Vice Chancellor or Warden.
20. Improper rendering of accounts for money drawn through any University office.
21. Coercing medical staff to render assistance to persons not entitled; any disorderly behaviour.
22. Any act of moral turpitude.
23. Any offence under law.
24. Offences under the Examination (Unfair Means and Disorderly Conduct) Regulations.
25. Violation of traffic rules notified by the University.
26. Improper behaviour while on tour or excursion.
27. Pasting objectionable posters; distributing objectionable pamphlets; writing on walls.
28. Disobeying teachers; not wearing prescribed uniform/ aprons/ safety gear; vandalism or violence.
29. Demonstrations; inciting protests; distributing handbills.
30. Unauthorised use of mobile/satellite phone within the campus.
31. Any harassment – physical, verbal, mental, sexual or electronic – against fellow students, teachers, employees or canteen/mess workers.

NATURE OF PENALTIES

- Written warning and information to the guardian; recording in the dossier of the student.
- Fine as prescribed from time to time.
- Suspension from the Class/School for 3/5/7/10 days or more, with effect on attendance; suspension from Hostel/Mess/Library and/or withdrawal of any academic or other University activity, privilege, benefit, right or facility.
- Suspension/cancellation of scholarship or financial assistance.
- Recovery of pecuniary loss to University property.
- Debarring from sports and activities.
- Disqualification from representative positions.
- Reallocation to another hostel.
- Expulsion from school/faculty/hostel/mess/library/club.
- Debarring from examination; rustication.
- Issue of Migration Certificate reflecting indiscipline.
- Disqualification from further studies or re-admission.

SUSPENSION PENDING ENQUIRY

Any student against whom a charge of misconduct has been made may be suspended from the rolls of the University by the Vice Chancellor during enquiry, or during trial of a cognisable offence by a court of law.

5.3 ANTI-RAGGING POLICY

1. "Ragging" means display of disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm, or raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in any institution.
2. Ragging in any form, inside or outside the campus, is **banned**.
3. Any student found indulging in ragging will be **summarily expelled** from the institution.
4. A person found guilty of ragging may be punished with rigorous imprisonment of up to three years and/or a fine of ₹25,000, or both, depending on the severity of the offence.

How to complain

Students can email the Anti-Ragging Committee. Based on the complaint and available evidence, the Committee investigates the case and arrives at a verdict through a confidential process.

Responsibilities of the Anti-Ragging Committee

Carries out surprise checks in probable areas of ragging; ensures anti-ragging instructions are displayed prominently; maintains updated lists of students including addresses and phone numbers.

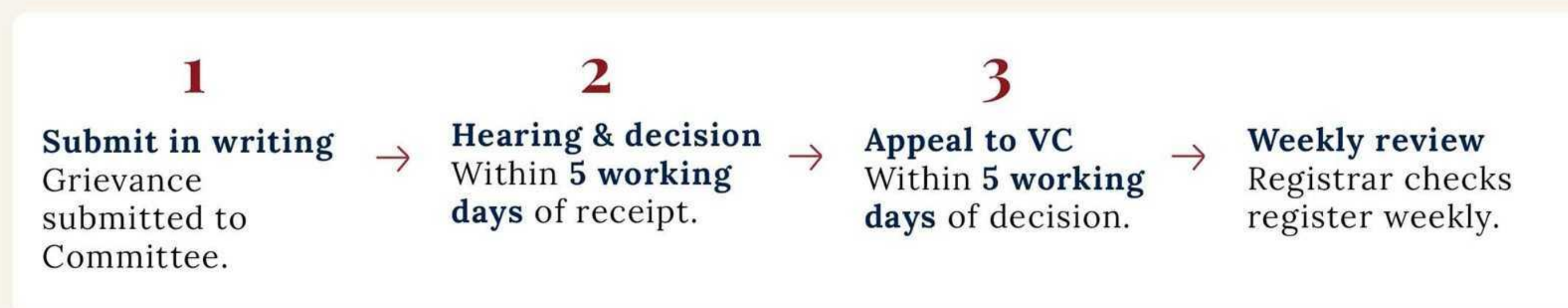

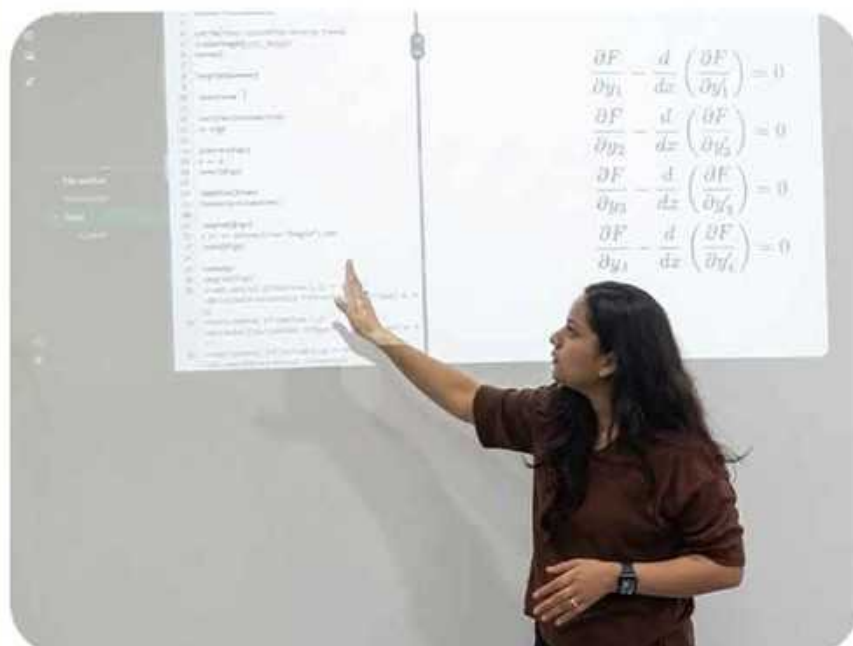

8.1 MENTAL HEALTH & COUNSELLING

YOURDOST – MENTAL HEALTH COMES FIRST

University life can be intense. Between academics, social life and figuring out your future, it's easy to feel overwhelmed. That's where **YourDOST** comes in: a safe, confidential space to seek guidance, manage stress and prioritise your mental health.

- One-on-one online counselling with certified psychologists – 24/7.
- Regular in-person counselling sessions on campus.
- Confidential and anonymous – no stigma, no judgement.
- Access via the YourDOST app or yourdost.com.



8.2 HEALTH FACILITIES

Medical Room & Campus Nurse

An on-campus **Medical Room** is equipped for basic first-aid and immediate medical support. A **qualified nurse** is available on campus for routine health concerns, preliminary care and medical emergency guidance.

Hospital Tie-Ups

For advanced treatment and specialised care, the University has tie-ups with **Artemis Hospital** and other nearby medical institutions. Students may avail priority assistance and special discounted benefits, subject to hospital policies.

Insurance & Infirmary

All hostels are equipped with **first-aid boxes**. The campus **Infirmary** provides immediate care; on the infirmary doctor's recommendation, students are transferred to hospital. The **IILM University medical health insurance card** can be utilised for hospital expenses.



8.3 SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

IILM University is committed to fostering an inclusive, accessible and equitable learning environment for all students, including persons with disabilities and students with special needs. In line with UGC guidelines, the University works towards a barrier-free campus enabling equal participation in academic and campus life.

Barrier-Free Infrastructure

Ramps, lifts, handrails and accessible pathways at key locations across campus.

Accessible Facilities

Convenient access to classrooms, libraries, administrative offices, washrooms and common areas.

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9.1 HOSTELS AT A GLANCE

- **Girls' Hostel (inside campus)** – safe, secure, close to classrooms.
- **Boys' Hostel** – comfortable rooms with shared common areas.
- **MBA Girls' Hostel (outside campus)** independent living with University support.

RESIDENTIAL LIFE FEATURES

- Furnished rooms designed for comfortable, functional living.
- Wi-Fi connectivity supporting academic work and digital learning.
- Dedicated wardens and support staff.
- Housekeeping support for cleanliness and convenience.
- Common recreational areas for social interaction and relaxation.

ROOM ALLOTMENT & ROOMMATE

- **Allocation** is made by the University on a twin/triple-sharing basis for the full academic year; roommates are from the same batch.
- **Returning students** (2nd year+) may indicate roommate preference via the Roommate Preference Form – both students must request each other.
- **Room changes** mid-session are not possible without formal authorisation.
- **Room reassignment** may be requested via the Warden for infrastructure issues; Office of Student Affairs (OSA) reserves the right to reassign any room.
- **Roommate conflict** – 3 steps: (1) communicate with roommate; (2) seek Warden's mediation; (3) OSA may facilitate change based on availability.
- **Keys** – students are issued room, wardrobe and desk keys and are responsible for them. Duplicating keys is a punishable offence. Lost keys replaced at cost.
- **Room clearance** – inform Warden 24 hrs before check-out; submit Room Checklist Form ≥4 hrs before; hand over keys; obtain hostel clearance from Dean of Students. Late check-out fine: ₹2,000/day.

9.2 RESIDENCE LIFE POLICY

Room condition & personal appliances

Submit the **Room Checklist** Form at allotment to declare move-in condition. Personal electrical appliances kettles, induction plates, microwaves, mini-fridges, irons, heaters, immersion rods are **prohibited** to prevent fire hazards. Common facilities are provided.

No alterations to University property

Painting, decals, nailing fixtures to walls/ceilings and drilling holes are not permitted. Defacing walls, doors or common areas attracts disciplinary action.

Common areas & Quiet Hours

Common areas belong to all residents. Damage/loss billed at **3× repair/replacement cost**. **Quiet Hours: 12 midnight–7:00 am** — no loud music or noise in rooms, common rooms, washrooms or corridors.

Prohibited items in rooms

- Alcohol bottles; hookahs / bongs / chillums / water pipes; drug-manufacture paraphernalia.
- Any high-voltage electrical appliance.
- Unauthorised substances, pets, weapons; guests staying overnight.

ENTRY & EXIT PROCEDURE

Return timings (Registrar's Office rules)

Entry/exit registered through **biometric systems** at the gate. No exit between **10:00 pm and 6:00 am** without prior permission. Failure to return on time: disciplinary infraction + intimation to parents/guardians.

Parental approval systems (overnight)

Case-by-Case (all UG students): for a night out, parent/guardian must approve by **6:00 pm on the day of exit, every time**. Warden contacts student → parent → authorities if timings are breached.

HOSTEL VISITATION RULES

Visitors

Visitors do not have access to hostel rooms. They may meet students on campus or at the hostel entrance between **8:00 am and 6:00 pm** only. Late-night departures for birthdays or celebrations cannot be accommodated.

Parents/Guardians

May access their ward's room only during move-in (Orientation) and move-out. Meetings in common rooms are permitted. Only female guardians may enter the girls' hostel; only male guardians the boys' hostel.

Staff/Faculty

Must carry University ID, sign in at the front desk, and may enter rooms only with special approval from the Vice President of the University.



HEALTH & EMERGENCY IN THE HOSTEL

- All hostels equipped with a **first-aid box**. Emergencies referred to the Infirmary on campus.
- On infirmary doctor's recommendation, student transferred to nearest hospital. **IILM medical health insurance** card can be used for expenses.
- Mental health crisis → contact **Hostel Manager immediately**. Hostel authorities notify parents if required.

PSYCHOACTIVE SUBSTANCES — ZERO TOLERANCE

Strictly prohibited on University

The sale, distribution, manufacture and use of alcohol, tobacco and controlled substances is banned. Students found consuming or possessing alcohol or narcotics will be **reported to authorities**; disorderly behaviour after consumption attracts strict disciplinary action. Prohibited items include alcohol bottles, hookahs/bongs, chillums, water pipes and drug-manufacture paraphernalia. Hostel authorities may conduct **room inspections** to maintain a substance-free campus.

ROOM INSPECTIONS

Hostel authorities may inspect a student's room without consent or prior notification where circumstances indicate danger to an individual's wellbeing or a violation of University regulations.

- Conducted by **Warden/Senior Warden, Hostel Manager** or **senior OSA staff**.
- Formal inspection permit issued by Vice President/Pro VC/COO.
- Team knocks; residents have **2 minutes** to open door. After 3 minutes without response, inspecting officer may enter without permission.
- Inspection conducted in presence of occupants wherever possible.
- Students who believe the procedure was violated may appeal to the **Vice Chancellor**.

RAGGING & SEXUAL HARASSMENT IN THE HOSTEL

IILM University has zero tolerance. To file a **ragging complaint**, email the Anti-Ragging Committee. For **sexual harassment**, email the ICC.

RESIDENTS' CHARTER — YOUR RIGHTS IN THE HOSTEL

Every resident of IILM University's hostels has the following rights. These are binding on all students.

- The right to **study and sleep peacefully** in the allotted room, free from undue interference from roommates and/or peers.
- The right to be treated as an **equal, without fear of harassment**, intimidation, bullying, or physical and/or emotional harm.
- The right to **free and uninhibited access to common spaces**.
- The right to be **consulted, and to grant or deny permission**, on having peers invited into the allotted room.
- The right to have roommates and/or peers **respect personal belongings**.
- The right to **free and uninhibited access** to the allotted room at all times.
- The right to **privacy**. Violations of these rights can be reported to the concerned authorities for further action.

9.3 HOSTEL CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1 Hostel rooms are subject to inspection at any time. Wardens ensure rooms, common rooms, verandas and surroundings are neat and tidy; no unauthorised items – liquor, narcotic drugs, psychotropic substances, lethal weapons.
- 2 Observe the notified timings for meals and for returning after leaving campus on weekends or other days.
- 3 Require an Out Pass for outings on weekends or non-class days. Issued by Faculty Coordinator, with Warden and Security Officer informed. Carry Student ID at all times.
- 4 On weekdays, leave campus in an emergency with parental consent and Faculty Coordinator/mentor approval.
- 5 Return before 10:00 pm (UG) and 10:00 pm (PG). No exit after 10:00 pm and before 6:00 am without prior permission in an emergency.
- 6 Do not bring back any item prohibited on campus.
- 7 Keep rooms neat and tidy and maintain proper hygiene at all times.
- 8 Ensure proper hygiene in the use of common rooms and toilets.
- 9 Use electricity, water and other facilities in an environmentally friendly manner; avoid wastage.
- 10 Not allowed to enter areas designated exclusively for the opposite sex.
- 11 Be decently and appropriately dressed at all times on campus.
- 12 Keep valuables under lock and key in your own room. University is not responsible for the safety or loss of personal property.
- 13 Use University property – furniture, fittings, equipment – with due care. Negligent damage attracts financial and other penalties; lost room keys replaced at cost.
- 14 Do not keep or store unauthorised substances, property, pets or weapons, or allow guests to stay in rooms.
- 15 Maintain high standards of decorum and propriety. Do not display pornographic material, gamble, rag or sexually harass. Do not discriminate on race, religion or place of origin; foreign students must be shown due courtesy and dignity.
- 16 Do not smoke or use psychotropic drugs or alcohol on campus. Possession itself is a breach of these regulations.
- 17 Do not post or circulate objectionable or obscene material in any form – notices, pictures, posters, leaflets, SMS, emails, etc.
- 18 Do not use high-voltage electrical equipment (heating coils, irons, etc.) in rooms. Such items will be seized and placed before the Disciplinary Committee.
- 19 Refrain from any behaviour causing environmental pollution, including noise pollution.
- 20 Report to the Warden any illegal activity or unacceptable behaviour witnessed on campus.
- 21 Deal with roommates, classmates, University employees and service providers with courtesy and respect at all times.
- 22 Take proper care of hostel and campus premises. Do not disfigure, deface or damage buildings, articles or fixtures. Total replacement cost borne individually or collectively; such acts also invite disciplinary action up to expulsion.
- 23 Apprise yourself of the University's anti-ragging regulations and the consequences and penalties for ragging.

10.3 BLOOD DONATION CAMPS

Organised annually in collaboration with organisations such as the **Red Cross Society**. Students take the lead on scheduling, promoting and running the camp, with guidance from faculty, building civic responsibility and community awareness.

10.4 ROSHNI RAI SCHOOL

Provides **free education to children from underprivileged backgrounds**, motivating parents in slum areas to send children to school. Students receive educational kits books, stationery, uniforms and midday snacks – and the school promotes holistic development through debates, music, crafts, skits and excursions.

10.2 LEGAL AID CLINIC

The **Legal Aid Clinic of the School of Law** promotes access to justice for marginalised communities, aligned with **Article 39A** of the Constitution of India. Students handle family disputes, labour rights, women's rights and child rights under faculty guidance building practical legal skills while serving the community.

10.5 STUDENT-LED SERVICE

Rotaract empowers students to create meaningful social impact through leadership, service initiatives and community engagement. **Community engagement activities** run year-round: outreach, awareness and volunteering. Role of Parents & *Guardians*

At IILM University, we believe that the success of every student is rooted in a strong, respectful partnership between the University, the student and their parents or guardians. Your involvement plays a pivotal role in supporting your ward's academic journey, personal growth and overall wellbeing. Outlined below are the key roles expected of all parents and guardians; these responsibilities are essential and should be fulfilled throughout your ward's time at the University.

01 Promote Independence and Responsibility

Encourage your ward to become self-reliant and accountable for academic performance, personal conduct and daily responsibilities. Refrain from micromanaging; allow your child to make their own decisions and learn through experience. Reinforce discipline, time management, regular attendance and academic integrity.

02 Foster Healthy and Open Communication

Maintain consistent, supportive communication with your ward – especially during adjustment or stress. Encourage them to approach faculty, mentors or Student Affairs staff for challenges. Avoid unnecessary interference in everyday University matters; empower your ward to resolve issues through proper channels.

03 Respect University Policies and Procedures

Familiarise yourself with rules and policies in this handbook and ensure your ward complies. Do not attempt to bypass formal processes or seek special treatment. Understand that professional boundaries are maintained to uphold fairness, equity and student growth.

04 Participate in University Engagements

Attend important University events orientation programmes (Deeksharambh), convocation ceremonies and parent-student meetings. Engage in workshops that help you better understand the student experience at IILM.

05 Encourage Holistic Development

Motivate your ward to participate in extracurricular activities, sports, clubs, community service and leadership opportunities. Acknowledge that personal development, emotional resilience and interpersonal skills are as vital as academic achievements.

06 Ensure Accurate and Transparent Communication

Confirm contact details and personal information are correctly submitted to the University. Keep phone number, email and address updated for timely notifications and emergencies. Do not submit forged or misleading documents; all information must be truthful and verifiable.

07 Trust the University Ecosystem

Place confidence in the faculty, systems and student support structures at IILM University. Allow your ward to face challenges independently, knowing appropriate support is always available. Learning to adapt, self-regulate and grow through real-life situations is a vital part of becoming a responsible adult. **A note for hostel parents:** you play a formal role in the hostel approval systems record your choice through the Leave Approval and Consent Form, provide per-instance approvals under Case-by-Case (all UG), and remain reachable for the Warden's safety escalation process.
